<u>Area of Pain</u>	<u>Structure</u>	<u>Acute Trauma</u>	<u>Chronic Overuse Injuries</u>
1	Quadriceps muscle	Strain or rupture, contusion	Strain
2	Quadriceps tendon, suprapatellar tendon	Avulsion of Quadriceps tendon, suprapatella bursitis	Tendinitis, apophysitis in younger individuals
3	Vastus medialis obliquus (VMO) muscle, medial	Strain of medial retinaculum or strain of VMO due to patella dislocation	Patella tracking disorder with chronic strain/sprain of medial retinaculum or VMO

<b>4</b>	Patella, patella bursa	Fracture, dislocation, bursitis	Bipartite patella, chondromalacia patella
<b>5</b>	Medial tibiofemoral joint, meniscus, coronary ligament, medial patellofemoral ligament, medial plica	Fracture, medial meniscus tear, traumatic plica irritation	Sprain of either coronary ligament or patellofemoral ligament, or medial plica
<b>6</b>	Infrapatella fat pad	Fat pad irritation	Fat pad irritation
<b>7</b>	Patella tendon, infrapatella bursa	Bursitis	Patella tendinitis
<b>8</b>	Medial proximal tibia, pes anserinus insertion	Fracture, pes anserinus bursitis	Pes anserinus bursitis
<b>9</b>	Tibial tuberosity, patella tendon insertion	Fracture, avulsion fracture	Osgood-Schlatter disease in younger: patella insertion tendonitis in adults
<b>10</b>	Tibialis anterior, extensor tendons	Contusion	Anterior shin splints, extensor strain
<b>11</b>	Tibia	Fracture	Stress fracture
<b>12</b>	MCL, medial meniscus	Medial collateral sprain or rupture, medial meniscus tear	Mild MCL sprain, osteoarthritis
<b>13</b>	ITB	Contusion	ITB syndrome
<b>14</b>	Vastus lateralis, lateral retinaculum	Contusion	Vastus lateralis strain, lateral retinaculum sprain or fibrosis
<b>15</b>	Lateral tibiofemoral joint, lateral meniscus	Meniscus tear, fracture	Meniscus tear, capsular sprain
<b>16</b>	Fibular head, LCL insertion	Subluxation, dislocation, LCL sprain	Subluxation
<b>17</b>	Insertion of biceps femoris onto fibular head, peroneal nerve	Direct trauma to peroneal nerve	Biceps femoris insertional tenditis, peroneal nerve entrapment
<b>18</b>	Lateral meniscus, popliteus tendon, lateral	Lateral meniscus tear	Popliteus tendinitis, lateral gastrocnemius strain, lateral meniscus tear

<b>19</b>	Semimembranosus insertion, medial meniscus, semimembranosus bursa	Medial meniscus tear	Bursitis, insertinal tendinitis, medial meniscus tear
<b>20</b>	Medial head of gastrocnemius	Tennis leg	Strain of medial gastrinmenius
